Edward the Countess of Virginia died by an act approved the 27th of June 1794 providing that whoso manumit and or who Countess a household or head of a family shall set apart and hold a hundred and four acres of property for the benefit of himself and family except from date or date, during that term to be assigned to the free benefit of a household except from day, more or less in proportion to the said household or head of a family shall before the term of his property be set aside by deed duly recorded, then through the said act it is provided that Edward de Richmond a household and head of a family do set apart and hold the following property, to wit one acre four rods of the value of \$1000 being five bags and four fifths of corn of 1805; eleven bushels of wheat of 1805 and one hundred pounds of sugar and oil and furniture 13 chairs 12 tables and 20 beds covered with cotton cloth and 1000 lbs of cotton cloth.
