and aforesaid present, a witness having in posse of land in the County of Southampton State
of Virginia, containing by survey 50 acres. Be it known and noted that the said land
is bounded by the land of Peacock and Cooper (lot 100 of section 10) Mr. Calver Hall,
Peacock and Cooper and border on the south side of S. A. Jackson's hill. It have
to hold said described lands together with all houses, rents, work and water course, profits
conveniences and franchises thereto belonging or acquired by the said General J. Morris
and William E. Peacock by his wife, widow administratrix and aforesaid former and
the said General J. Morris and wife do for themselves their wives, children, slaves
horses and effects by these presents, covenanted and agreed to and with the said General
J. Morris his heirs, executors, administrators and aforesaid widow and former dependents
said tract or parcel of land aforesaid with all and singular the houses and buildings
thereon and personal chattel and other of and from the said General J. Morris
and former whatever. So witness before the said General J. Morris and wife his wife
her widow and aforesaid wife Shadrack the day and year written above.
