

The Court of Justs made the 1st day of Jan'y 1877, between A. H. James and Thos. R. Jones, the wife of one part, and J. D. Pinner, Justice of second part, witnesses: that, in consideration of five dollars in hand paid, the said Justice of the first part do grant and convey with good warranty to the said A. H. James, he or assigns, the following and whole tract: a parcel of land situate in Southampton County, containing 200 acres to the same more or less bounded by the said Justice of the first part and the land of James R. Sledge, do hereby do leave the fragment of a land due to A. H. James to the Justice of the first part, portion in hand under style of J. D. Pinner J.C. dated Jan'y 17th 1877, and so demand. And it is agreed by the parties hereto that in case of a sale of the said land, it shall be upon a sale or auction unless it shall be made from under the said Justice of the first part, after having days for the return of taxes and sales, printed on the or more fulls places in this County, and upon such terms as the said Justice or Justice may direct - and for such event, the receipt shall be entitiled to a Receipt of five per cent on the said sale.
