

Mr. D. Schell made his 1st day of January A.D. 1877, before me, James C. Schell, Esq. & Scott and Co., the officers of the first part and 2d & 3d parts of the second part, the two first living residents of Southampton Co., the ten last of the County of Suffolk, State of Virginia, witnesseth: That whereas the said Mr. D. Schell and Henry and his wife did make on 1st day of January A.D. 1876, County of Suffolk, Esq. & Schell appeared, certain real estate described as follows: viz: the part of Land wherein the said Mr. D. Schell now resides, containing 6.6 acres and bounded and described as follows: on the west by the Collier River back, on the north by the tract of Land bounded by said Court of the title of A. P. Wrenhouse dec'd, on the east by the lands of Albie Williams dec'd and Mr. Scott dec'd, and on the south by the lands of Mrs. Scott dec'd, and the tract of land known as Scott's Old place, second, all that portion of the Harry P. Peagles tract of land now sold to Joseph R. Davis, bounded by Abington 150 acres more or less and bounded on the east by the Collier River back, and the south by Scott's Old Place, and the west by the Chesapeake Bay and on the north by the lands of J. G. Davis, formerly a part of the Harry P. Peagles tract, so Grand to seven or eight acres, by said David Scott on the 1st day of January A.D. 1876, with interest from 1st day of February 1876, commencing at 1/1600th of the true hundred dollars, and whereas also the said Mr. D. Schell did, on the 2nd day of March 1876, convey to George Chappell aforesaid, certain real estate described as follows: The tract of land on which he said Mr. D. Schell resides containing 6.6 acres, the part of Land purchased by said Mr. D. Schell from the Esq. of A. P. Wrenhouse dec'd, containing 6.6 acres and that portion of the land purchased from Henry Wrenhouse Esq. of the P. Wrenhouse, my wife J. G. Davis containing by Abington 150 acres. In trust, to secure a tract like E. G. Scott for the sum of one thousand dollars payable 1st October 1879, and whereas the said Mr. Wrenhouse has this day fully paid and discharged the said bonds due to Henry Wrenhouse and C. G. Scott, respectively, both principal and interest, more therefore this said witnesseth: That the said parties of the first part do hereby release each other from all rights and Mr. D. Schell, all the said real estate above mentioned, and acknowledge to him and his heirs forever, with general warranty.
