This Deed made the 1st day of January A.D. the 17th, between Mr. D. Bell
and Mary, his wife, of the first part and Benjamin H. Schell, of the second
part, all of Southampton County, State of Virginia, who both, for and in
consideration of the sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred and Fifty Dollars
(\$3,500.00) this day paid and the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the 1st
parties of the first part do grant and convey unto the said Benjamin H. Schell, the
following tract or parcels of land situated in Southampton County, and bounded as
described as follows viz.: First, the tract of land commonly known as the General Street
Containing 520 acres, it being the tract of land purchased by Edwards Gads of
Cris & Cranes, by said Cranes bearing date on the 3rd day of August A.D. 1852, and whence
is hereby made to said Bell for a further description of said tract, and all other parts
of land lying adjacent to said tract purchased by said Mr. D. Bell of the estate of
J. Schell and lying west of said General Street bounded by what is known as
the Old Creek Road on the right, containing by estimation 46 acres. Secondly, all
that tract of the New O. Diggs tract of lands set aside to Joseph P. Davis
containing by estimation 3.50 acres and bounded and described as follows: on the
west by the land purchased by Joseph P. Davis of said Mr. D. Bell's tract,
and by the Ophamuee swamp, on the south by the Creek and Bay, and on
the N.E. by the Cabin Creek road, to him and his heirs forever. And the said Mr. D. Bell
doth also convey said tract of land with general warranty.
