Rogers, Twelve acre tract of land situated in the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, & being a tract of land known as _____ and bounded by the lands of _____ Messrs Thomas and Mrs Susan Richards and others, and said tract contain fifty five acres more or less, and meads, one crop and wheats, twenty three hogs, six cattle and four sheep, forming implements of every kind, household and kitchen furniture. On trust however to receive and hold for and hundred and fifty dollars and interest thereon till paid, leaving due and good fees due, to be paid on receipt money of the United States, which shall be paid and Willm. B. Dick, & if defaulted, an agreed upon by the parties to this deed, that if a debt shall become owing, it shall be as the dividing of the said Willm. B. Dick or his legal representative, who shall over-see and trustee to sell for cash after giving twenty days notice of time and place of sale, pay all necessary expense to reach the proceeds of this sale, including the duties for per cent Commission, pay said sum and interest to the said Willm.
