This Clerk of South made this 19th day of June 1877, between David H. Barham and
Martha A. H. his wife of one part and A. B. Barham, Justice of the second part, witnesses, that in
presence of five others, the said parties of the first part do grant and convey with general
warranty to the said J. A. Barham, Justice, the following and abate to-wit: one tract of land
situated in Southampton County, containing 40^{acres} 7^{sq} rods, to the same more or less, bounded by the
lands of W. D. Nettleton, the estate of Mrs. Nancy Jeter and others, some being land upon
which the said parties now live. Do intend to secure the payment of a bond of ten dollars with
this debt for one thousand and fifty dollars due by J. H. Barham and Nancy Barham
to W. H. Morris. And it is agreed by the parties to this deed, that no sale shall take place
by virtue hereof, before Dec. 1, 1877, provided one half of the principal and interest of this
bond hereby secured is paid on or before that time. And if that same is paid by that time,
then the said W. H. Morris agrees to wait for the balance until Dec. 1, 1877. And
in the event of a sale, the trustee shall sell for cash or such terms as the said W. H. Morris
may desire and shall be entitled to five per cent Commission on gross sale - and the
