

Small lot (named as the Tree of Paradise); then next northwardly to a point in the dividing line between said
Seaboard Land, and the land of said Parrot Estate; thence along said Parrot's land to the beginning of

going beyond said A. D. Storck, his personal representative or agent, the sum of fifty dollars yearly,

yearly, as foreseen; and the said Seaboard Company and Company, were the right which
is hereby conceded to it by the said Storck, of any land during the continuance of this lease to
cancel and take the same or giving six months notice of such severance to said Storck, or his
personal representative or agent, and at the termination of such lease (whence which may take
place) the said Company shall have, right to remove all trees, rails, walls, houses or other
improvements (with such wharf as it may have erected adjoining the land over lands, built on
the said land by the said Company; and the said Storck in consideration of a fee paid over
the Seaboard and Parrot's Land and in the Blackwater river, from the mouth of the river, which
said Land, the hereby agrees that the owners or managers of such Seaboard above aforesaid
to pay, have the privilege of tying or fastening such Seaboard to the lands or trees
above the land held as aforesaid, and to use a reasonable space on said lands to repair
said trees, the space not being, but to exceed the length of about of such Seaboard, their privilege
and consideration, to be limited, on the part of the said Company, during the time left to cancel
of any time when the said Storck shall desire, to first giving thirty days notice thereof
in writing where the said Storck and wife have her/his
place hands and affix their seals, the date first herein
written and the said Seaboard and Parrot's Land each Company
