I certify we witnessed a return of the Circuit Court of Southampton County in the County with Ralph E. Gray and others against the adm'r of Jas. Gray and others, Mr. H. Pease, Commissioner, did sell at public auction, in the town of Southampton on the 5th Monday in December last, a tract of land lying near Peaport Right in Southampton County, containing about one hundred acres, belonging to the estate of James Gray, dec'd; and at the sale so made, Benjamin E. Gray became the purchaser by bidding therefor the sum of two hundred dollars, for the said tract made this 25th day of December A.D. between H. Pease, Commissioner of the said park and Benjamin E. Gray of the said first witness, that he did bid the said sum for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars to him in hand paid by the said Benjamin E. Gray, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, did grant, bargain and sell unto the said R. E. That Deed of Assignment made this 10th day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy six, between Robert S. Pease, Assignor, and the R. H. Pease, Heir of the first part, and Richard S. Pease, of the other part, all of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, recited as follows: Whereas the said Robert S. Pease did, by Act of Assembly, recorded in the Clerk's Office of the County of said County, on the 1st day of March 1876, grant and convey to the said R. H. Pease, his Heir, during his life, a certain tract or parcel of ground, bounded and described in said Act of Assembly, being in Southampton County, bounded by the lands of Jas. Gray, Peaport, and by the lands of the said Richard S. Pease, and the same contained one hundred and one acre and 1/2, which said tract of land was then owned and occupied by the said Richard S. Pease, and the same is now owned and occupied by the said Richard S. Pease, his Heir, and by the said R. H. Pease, and to have the said tract of land held in fee simple, and to have the same held in fee simple in accordance of certain conditions mentioned in the said Act of Assembly.
