

The Deed made this 1st day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty seven, between Edward S. Peirce of the second party, and Charles J. Scott debt grantor to the said Edward S. Peirce with general warranty, all of his right title and interest to a certain piece or parcel of land containing fifty acres more or less, lying in the County of Southampton State of Virginia, and bounded as follows, commencing at a corner post in Maryland State line, thence 25 feet to a small brook, thence due south 14 poles, a variation South 8 poles, 45 degrees East 97 1/2 poles to ground bridge across the road leading to Pohick, thence along the said South 55 degree 1/2 pole to the sign post, thence along the Pohick road due north 80 poles, a variation, thence South 25 feet, thence due South 85 to a local division and bounded on the east by 2d & 3d Maryland, on the west by S. & Bristol Mts, local, South by S. Pole, on the north by Maryland State line and 2d. Sister do. The said Charles J. Scott warrants that he has the right to convey the said land to the grantee, that he has done no act to interfere with the said land, that the grantee shall have quiet possession of the said land, free all encumbrances, and that Charles J. A. Conine trustee as aforesaid, did on the 15th day of February 1877, after due advertisement sell the said interest for cash, and whereat at the said sale, Charles Knight became the purchaser of the said interest by bidding therefor the sum of ten thousand and thirty dollars, and whereas the said Knight has fully paid the same and is now entitled to a deed for the same. Now therefore I do witness this day of April 1877, between J. A. Conine, trustee of the first, and Charles Pepe of the second party, witnessed that in consideration of the sum of \$530 in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said J. A. Conine, trustee, as aforesaid does hereby grant and convey with special warranty to the said Charles Knight and his heirs forever, all the interest the said Charles and C. H. Pepe now have in the real estate formerly belonging to Charles Pepe do, same being 55 acres, in the same manner left situated in Southampton, and bounded by the lands of Dr. C. Pepe estate, H. C.
