Stephenson of the first part, did grant unto A. J. Corcoran with general warranty, all of his right, title and interest in a certain parcel of land containing twenty six acres more or less, to have a portion of the land bought of Meredith Stephenson, and bounded as follows: Commencing at a pine post corner on Acquies Creek line, thence down through Corcoran's land to Rightwell's Swamp, thence up and of said Swamp to the intersection of Whitfield Branch; thence said branch to a Mark found corner of James Johnson's land, thence along said Johnson's land to the beginning.

This Ord made this 30th day of January 1777 between Sarah C. Bell of the first part, and A. C. Griffin, Justice of the second part, all of the County of Southampton Virginia, witnesseth that Sarah C. Bell widow of A. C. Griffin and John Henry have without warranty to one Rand a whole the said Sarah C. Bell is empowered for the sum of three hundred and twenty eight dollars, bearing date date herewith, and payable to the said Rand administrator of A. C. Griffin deceased nine months after the date hereof, and whereas the said Sarah C. Bell wishes to secure the said A. C. Griffin's estate and John Henry against any claim which they may sustain in consequence of their warranty to the aforesaid note: Therefore this Ord Witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of one dollar and the sum of five dollars to her in hand paid, she the said Sarah C. Bell did grant unto the said Rand a whole with general warranty unto the said A. C. Griffin Justice of the second part, all of her life interest in and to that certain tract of land, which the late R. W. Bell did seize and possess, lying in Southampton County Virginia, it being the same assigned to her as shown, at the instance of the said R. W. Bell to Commissioner appointed for said purpose, together with the following personal property to wit: her mules, her cows, one year of Cows, two Cows, hogs, and of corn and all of her household and kitchen furniture. In trust to secure unto the said A. C. Griffin, A. C. Griffin and John Henry the payment of the aforesaid sum of three hundred and twenty eight dollars, in the event that the said Sarah C. Bell should default and fail to pay the same when it should due, and the said A. C.
