If the said Robt James shall fail or before the 1st day of December next, to pay the said debt, then the said Wm M. Bates Esq. shall have the privilege after ten days notice call all the property above herein conveyed for cash, and out of the proceeds may sell the within and sale, and balance of such proceeds pay and to the said Robt James or his assigns.
