This Agreement made this 1st day of November 1890 between J. & J. B. Jones Merchants and
James A. Jones and each of one part and James and John A. Chaselsky of the other part, witnesses
that the said parties of the first part agree to furnish the said parties of the second part, the
necessary supplies to wit: Flour of the Riverbank Milling Co. at \$25. per ton of 2000 lbs. fine
flour and having five barrels of N. B. Brown of 17 lbs. each for the good, second and third
sorts as well as to the contents of one hundred and sixty dollars which said supplies are to enable the
parties of the second part to support themselves and estimate the cost for the year 1891. In
consideration whereof the said parties of the second part agree and hereby give a bond
with two seals of cotton to weigh an net average of 15 lbs. per bale, to be given by them
during the year 1891, and agree to deliver to the parties of the first part the said five dollars
cash at their Stockhouse (Keweenaw Point) or such other as may be designated by the parties of
the first part on or before the 1st day December 1891.
