

desirous to obtain supplies during the year 1879 from the said Darden & Myrick for the amount of One Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars, and for taking the acknowledgement and recording this agreement, and the said Darden & Myrick having on their part agreed to furnish said supplies. Now the said Grant on his part, and in consideration of the above provisions doth hereby grant a Lien to the said Darden & Myrick on his whole interest in Corn, Potatoes, Peas and Cotton, it being one half of a one horse crop, Cultivated on the Farm known as the Cook Farm, for the above amount of advances, which has been made, or was intended to have been expended, and the said Grant binds himself agreeable to Law to deliver said crops above mentioned to Darden & Myrick at Newsoms Depot Va by or before December the 1st/79. This Lien is granted under an act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 2nd 1873, entitled an act to secure the advances for agricultural purposes.
