Conced Whereas by a decree of the County Court of Southampton rendered at Court held in the Chancery suit of Merrill against Merrill &c. et al. Williams in writing has appointed the said Commissioner to make a deed for the said tract of land to the said Charles Bradshaw: Now this Deed made the 16th day of March 1876, between the said Charles Bradshaw as purchaser of the first part and Charles Bradshaw of the second part, witnesses, that the said Charles Bradshaw for and in consideration of Two Hundred and eighty five dollars to him or him paid by the said Charles Bradshaw the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged with good will, bargain and sell with the said Charles Bradshaw his special warranty, the tract of land above described containing by estimate and Standard and twenty five acres more or less, and is bounded by the lands of Edwin Bradshaw, Dr. Davis, Joseph David & Nathan Johnson and others, it being the same tract of land on which said Nathan Merrill resided at the time of his death.
