of the sum of One Thousand Dollars the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged  
by the said Martha A. Gorrie date agreed with the said James T. Tappin all  
her right title and interest in a certain tract or parcel of land lying in  
the County of Southampton, containing by ascertainment two hundred acres  
and more or less and bounded by the lands of Mr. Abens, Clegg's, Mr. Jones  
String Jr. and the Second Swamp her interest in said land having descended  
to her from her Father Peter Gorrie deceased. Notifying the following signature thereto  
the day and date above written.

End. Know all men by these presents that I, Esekiah J. Hart of the County  
of Southampton and State of Virginia, for and in consideration of the  
sum of Two hundred and thirty four dollars and fifty five cents to me in  
hand paid by Mr. H. Morris late the following property  
do sell and convey to the said H. Morris late the following property  
to wit: One head of horses and six head of cattle above named free of inc-  
umbrance and against any action claims, subject Condition that if the  
said Esekiah J. Hart have not the said H. Morris given the sum of one  
hundred and thirty four dollars and forty five cents with interest according  
to a certain promissory note of the date of that sum payable to the said  
H. Morris sum the said shall be void or else to remain in full force and effect  
The aforesaid parties agreed that until the condition of this instrument is  
broken, the said property may remain in possession of the said Esekiah J.  
Hart, but after condition broken the said H. Morris and said may at their  
pleasure hold and remove the same, and may enter the premises of the said  
Esekiah J. Hart for that purpose.
