This Oath of Trust from J. G. Saunders to William A. Schell, trustee for the benefit of Jas. E. Schell, was this day received and acknowledged by said Saunders to be his act and deed, and admitted to record.

Contra. This Agreement made between Elizabeth McElroy, of the town just a head Keweenaw Co. Rock of the Copper prop., Keweenaw. That the said Elizabeth McElroy bargains and agrees that she said Henry C. Moore shall have a lease for tract of land known as the Ranch Place under the following conditions: She said Henry C. Moore is to build a small dwelling house and such other out houses as may be actually necessary and to occupy such houses and land at least one half of the present open land each year by paying and furnish of what is required to take the fence in good order and such land as he may clear to have the use of it two years free of rent, she said Henry C. Moore to do all the building at his own expense. It is not intended that he shall pay any part of what he may to make in a garden, potato patch and fruit patches equal size for the family. Should she said Elizabeth McElroy wish to sell the place at which John C. Moore lives to him again with the field and which the house is situated she is privileged to do so, and said Moore is to keep a reasonable portion of the fence in good order while he remains and if he leaves Henry C. Moore is to have possession of the whole. This Contract is to remain in force during the lifetime of Elizabeth McElroy except she sells the place and then she is to give Henry C. Moore four months notice before the end of the year in which the sale is made and to pay Henry C. Moore what losses accrued disseveredly present of the neighborhood may say the improvements he may have put on the place, except the fencing, & walls, and if he remains till poor done, he is to be paid for said improvements in the same way, but if he leaves the place before her decease, he is to receive nothing for said improvements till her decease. A full and fair sale of the land, & property where we have heretofore set our hand and affixed our seals the 18th day of September 1877.
