This Indenture, made and entered into on the 10th day of April, in the year of our Lord, eighteenth hundred and seventy seven, between James William Barclay and Mary Frances his wife, formerly Applegate's, John Walter Applegate and William Edward Applegate of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and William C. Keyrick of the same County and State of the other part, witnesseth that the said James William Barclay and Mary Frances his wife, John Walter Applegate and William Edward Applegate for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and twenty five dollars currency money of the Commonwealth to them not hereof paid by the said William C. Keyrick at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the said several parties hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents do, and each of them doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey, and confirm unto him, the said William C. Keyrick, his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel of land and premises situated lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton, State of Virginia, containing by survey one hundred and seventy four acres, it is here more or less, it being a tract of land left unto by their Uncle Dr. John A. Archibald died and bounded by the lands of James Edward, the said William C. Keyrick, George H. Pender, others, together with all its appurtenances thereto belonging, or in any wise appertaining to have and to hold the above described tract or parcel of land and premises unto all and singular its appurtenances unto him the said William C. Keyrick his heirs and assigns forever, to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said William C. Keyrick his heirs and assigns forever, and the said James William Barclay, and Mary Frances his wife, John Walter Applegate and William Edward Applegate, for themselves, their heirs executors and administrators, of and unto whom shall their duty, covenant and agree to and with the said William C. Keyrick his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns that they will by these presents warrants and forever defend all the right and title of the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises and every part or parcel thereof against the claims or demands of all and every other person or persons whatsoever. In witness whereof the said James William Barclay and Mary Frances his wife, John Walter Applegate and William Edward Applegate have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first above written.
