as in subscriber and acceptances us and amount not to exceed in the aggregate
the sum of One hundred dollars, to enable the said R. H. Jones to estimate
and harvest his crop the present year then, therefore, the said R. H. Jones
for and consideration of the advance aforesaid, hereby gives the said Skinner,
Etheridge & Brooks a bill upon all his crops of every description to be given
upon the above mentioned lands this year. And this also hereby conveys to him
the following article of personal property, to wit, 2 horses, 1 wagon, 1 cow,
1 gun, 1 saw, stock of tools and hardware, harness or carriage, corn,
seed &c, to have the payment of the advance aforesaid, out or before the
accrual of the same, to be paid by the said Skinner, Etheridge & Brooks
according to the stipulation contained in the original Agreement of Virginia
entitled "An Act concerning Advances for Agricultural purposes" that if the said
R. H. Jones shall fail to pay the said sum as aforesaid at the time above
stated, it shall be lawful for the said Skinner, Etheridge & Brooks to sell the
crops and personal property above described on the premises at auction for
cash, at the rate of five dollars per bushel, in Southampton County, and
with the proceeds of such sale pay the amount of said advances and all expenses
incurred by reason of these presents, and any surplus shall be paid over to me
