This Agreement entered into this 29th day of May 1777 between Darden and Myrick of the first part and Jack Kimbrell of the other part witnesses as follows. That whereas the said Jack Kimbrell is about to engage for the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous to obtain supplies during the year 1777 from the said Darden and Myrick for the sum of twenty five dollars, and for taking this acknowledgment and according to the agreement, and the said Darden and Myrick having on their part agreed to furnish said supplies, Now the said Jack Kimbrell on his part and in consideration of the above provisions doth hereby grant a deed to the said Darden and Myrick all the crops of cotton, corn, fodder, peas &c. and any and all other crops which the said Kimbrell may cultivate together with one work ox, eight head of hogs and their progeny in male, one cart and wheels, for the above amount of advances which he has made or was intended to have been advanced, and the said Kimbrell doth himself agreeable to law to deliver said crops or other mentioned to Darden and Myrick at Newmills Neck Va. by or before the 1st day of December 1777. This deed is granted under an act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 2nd 1778, entitled an act to secure the advances for agricultural purposes.
