Dardis for the amount of forty dollars and for taking the aforesaid amount and for according the aforementioned and for according the aforementioned and the said Jas J. Dardis having on his farm equal to twenty acres supplied, that the T. A. Bishop on his part and in consideration of the above mentioned debt hereby agrees to lend to said Jas J. Dardis, and undergoes expenses made the year 1877 on the land above the said Bishop now lend to long the above amount, for the amount advanced to him the sum which has been or was intended to have been expended, and the said Bishop binds himself agreeably to have to deliver said sum unto the aforesaid Jas J. Dardis at Mechanics Depot No. 1, by or before the 1st day of January 1878. Said sum is granted under the seal of the Circuit Attorney of Virginia a/cd. and dated June 8th 1877, certified and act to secure the advance for agricultural purposes.
