

Southampton County, In the Clerk's Office June 18th 1777.
 This Writing or agreement between Jacob Seeman and Dorcas Seeman
 containing a bill in the name of the said Jacob Seeman for money or advance
 was acknowledged by said Seeman to be his act and deed, and subscribed to
 both, W. Edwards &c.

This agreement entered into this 15th day of April 1777, between Jas. J.
 Dorcas, of the first part, and Jack Seeman, of the other part, whereby
 as follows: That whereas the said Jack Seeman could not obtain a passage out of the
 attention of the said, and is desired to have sufficient during the year 1777,
 from the said Jas. J. Dorcas, in the amount of forty dollars out for taking
 the acknowledgment and for recording this agreement, and the said Jas. J.
 Dorcas having on his part agreed to furnish said sufficient, does, the said
 Jack Seeman on his part and in consideration of the above proceeds do hereby
 grant to him to the said Jas. J. Dorcas, on his part of certain proceeds due him
 calculating on the term in which Mr. A. & J. Seeman have lived - this year -
 for the amount advanced to him this year which has lived or was intended to
 have been advanced, and the said Seeman binds himself agreeable to law to
 deliver said crops above mentioned to Jas. J. Dorcas at Richmond, before the
 or before the 1st day of December 1777. This deed is granted under and Act of
 the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2nd 1775 entitled an act to
 secure the debtors for legal and honest just debts.

 North Carolina to Richard & Charles of Northampton County, and State

 hundred and eleven (111) dollars, to them paid by Richard & Charles, the
 receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have conveyed and sold and by
 their parents do, bargain, sell and convey to said Richard & Charles and to

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
