This Deed, made this 5th day of June 1877, between William Porter grantor of
the first part, and M. Edwards lessee (all of the County of Southampton
State of Virginia) witnesses: that the said William Porter did grant, bargain
and sell unto the said M. Edwards the following personal property, to wit: the
said William Porter's entire crop of corn, fodder, cotton and peanuts which he
is cultivating on the farm belonging to J. L. Edwards lying in the aforesaid
County of Southampton - said crops to be delivered as soon as they can be gathered
into the said bales, or in the bays that the said Porter shall for any reason
fail to gather them, when said bales shall be about at the premises at any time
after Nov. 1st 1877, all of said property conveyed in trust to secure the following
debt for said crop now due J. L. Edwards dated Feb. 16, 1877 and due as or before
November 1st 1877, for one hundred and twenty five dollars (\$125).

Whereas there all owed by these parties, that S. J. Willard of the County of South-
ampton State of Virginia, that for and in consideration of one hundred dollars to
be and have paid by Dandee and Hyrick and Jas. J. Dandee of the above said
County and State, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained, sold
and conveyed unto the said Dandee and Hyrick and Jas. J. Dandee of the
following property, to wit: two bales of low seed, cotton weighing not less than
450 pounds each to be delivered at Dandee's Office Va., which cotton is over-
weight and satisfactory on the present ginning crop, the proceeds of which cotton
shall be divided proportionately between Dandee and Hyrick and Jas. J. Dandee,
then, the said Dandee do covenant and bind myself to deliver all of the above
mentioned cotton to the undersigned Dandee and Hyrick and Jas. J. Dandee by or
before the first day of November 1877, and after that time the said Dandee and
Hyrick and Jas. J. Dandee shall have full, legal and full power to de-
mand and enforce payment of the same.
