Know all men by these presents, That Louisa Jones of the County of Southampton  
State of Virginia of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of one  
dollar to her in hand paid by Eugene J. Cuffman of the County and State aforesaid  
of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and for the further  
consideration of the love and affection I have toward him as my dutiful nephew  
have bargained, sold and conveyed and do by these presents convey, all and  
convey unto him the said Eugene J. Cuffman and his heirs a certain tract or parcel  
of land situated in the County and State aforesaid, adjoining the lands of Charles  
Garrison, Mrs Knott land and others, bounded at places to wch beginning abt  
black gum in the Cattail swamp just the end of the poor house land, thence along  
the line of the poor house land and eastern declivity to a hickory, thence N.E.  
to a hickory, thence Southeastern declivity to a small gum on the edge of the low  
branch, thence in the line of the poor house land, thence along a line of small  
ld tree and the end of the low branch to its mouth at the S. Westward corner of  
the property, thence Eastward along the mounbrongue of the north end of the  
property to the North eastern corner of the same, being a corner in G. Garrison's  
land, thence Southward along the eastern edge of the property, to a maple  
corner in G. Garrison's line, thence westward along the Southern part of the  
property to a maple corner in G. Garrison's line, thence northward along the  
western edge of the property to a gum, corner in G. Garrison's line, thence  
westward along G. Garrison's line, to a black gum, at the old dam, corner  
in G. Garrison's line, thence northeast along a line of wanted tree at the  
end of the Cattail swamp, to the first ditch containing ten hundred rods  
or thereabouts, east hundred rods or near that of the said tract named above,  
was purchased on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of April A.D. 1867, granted by deed of gift  
without consideration and without warranty, to Chuck L. Goff of the County of  
and State aforesaid, and the said Chuck L. Goff having sold to the said Eugene J. Cuffman  
all the right, title and interest owned by him, the said Goff, to him and to hold  
the said land and premises with all its improvements and appurtenances unto  
him the said Eugene J. Cuffman and his heirs forever. And I the said Louisa Jones  
do for myself and my heirs, covenant to and with the said Eugene J. Cuffman  
and his heirs what I will warrant and by these presents forever defend the title  
fully, completely to him the said Eugene J. Cuffman and his heirs against the true  
full claim of any and all persons whatsoever.

I do solemnly swear that I have hereunto set my hand and seal
