Butler, then and there lawfully acting, was the owner of the following described lands, lying in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, to-wit: One hundred and thirty acres of land, containing two hundred and forty acres of the same more or less, and bounded by the lands of Col. Thos. Kelly's Co., Lewis W. Shepard's claim, James Selph's and others. In trust to secure \$2000.00 to be paid by said debt due by said J. W. D. Colburn, dated June 10th 1877. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the 10th day of June A.D. 1877.

The Agreement, made the 10th day of May 1877, between Alfred J. Addison, of the City of Richmond, and State of Virginia, of the first part, and L. B. Williams, of the County of So. Stafford and State of Virginia, of the second part. Whereas, That the said Alfred J. Addison, in execution of the covenants of the first part, hereinafter written, having entered and agreed with the said L. B. Williams that they will advance to him, between the date of January 1, 1877, and January 1, 1878, the sum of Forty Two & 50/100 Dollars, payable December 1st 1877. And for and in consideration of the covenants and contents, the said bond of the second part being payable at the time mentioned, and being engaged in the cultivation of the land to the said party of the second part, and being prepared to send and deliver to the said Alfred J. Addison his crops of peanuts, cotton, corn &c. to be grown during the year 1877, when the land hereinafter specified, to be sold by the said Alfred J. Addison, or any and all who may be agreed on as agents, to be employed by him for the purpose, and the said proceeds, after payment of commissions and charges, to be applied to the payment of the note or notes or notes given by the said party of the second part, at command on the said day of the second part. And the said party of the second part, specially covenants and agrees to execute, and do hereby give, grant, and sell in favor of the said Alfred J. Addison a lien on the crops which may be made during the year 1877, when the following land or the cultivation of which the said party of the second part is entitled to be returned: that is to say, a certain tract of land in the County of So. Stafford and State of Virginia.
