

And this Indenture made this 15th day of November 1796, between W. S. Goodwyn, Comptroller of the Circuit Court of Southampton County of the first part, and William Prince of the County of Southampton of the second part, a certain parcel and to the date of the Circuit Court of Southampton County, extend at the term of said Court in the year _____ in the chancery suit of Henry & Lewis against others, certain Commissioners were directed to sell at public auction, the mill and land thereto attached, including a certain piece of land situated to contain about 100 acres sold and conveyed by the said William Prince to Samuel Drury by deed dated the _____ day of _____ in the year (6) which deed appeared is made for more particular description of said land) the share of which said mill and land, was devised to Jos. A. Drury by the said Samuel Drury in his will, and half interest in which was conveyed to the said William Prince by the said Jos. A. Drury by deed dated the _____ day of _____ in the year _____ and the said Jos. A. Drury did sign and pass up of the remaining half interest in said mill and land, which interest was sold by the said Commissioners pursuant to the said deed above stated, and the said William Prince became the purchaser, and has paid all the purchase money, and whereas the said Circuit Court returned a decree in the said chancery suit at November 1796, appointing the above named W. S. Goodwyn, a Commissioner to make and execute to the said William Prince, a deed of bargain and sale for the interest of the said Jos. A. Drury in the said mill and land as before stated and decreed, And this Indenture witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the premises, and pursuant to the direction of the last named decree of the Circuit Court of Southampton County, extend at December term 1796, the chancery suit of Henry & Lewis against others, the said W. S. Goodwyn, Commissioner as aforesaid, did give, grant and convey unto the said William Prince all the interest in the said mill and land before stated and decreed, of which the said Jos. A. Drury died, signed and passed up with special warranty, witness the following signatures and seal the day and year before stated.

And this Deed, made this twenty six day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy four, between J. S. Patton and Henry J. Patton his wife of the first part, and Colins Nicholas of the second part, witnesses, And in consideration of the sum of three hundred and thirty two dollars, the said J. S. Patton and Henry J. Patton do grant unto the said Colins Nicholas with general warranty, all one hundred and eighty one acres of that portion of the Redwine Tract land which was purchased by J. S. Patton and lying on the west side of the road running from Station Hole out to the Black Oak tract, bounded on the north by the land of John Searcy, on the east by the land of Dr. Davis deceased, on the south by the land of Colins Nicholas and Walter Vick.
