This Deed from W. H. Spang's wife Sale to Trustees of the Baptist Church,
was read and together with the certificate thereof amended, advised to us
By, W. Edwards & Co.

And This Deed made this 2nd day of April 1877, between Joseph N. Dabham
of the one part and Geo. C. Spator, James M. Corbett and H. S. Dabham School
Trustees of the other part, all of the County of Southampton
and State of Virginia, witnesses: that the said Joseph N. Dabham for and
in consideration of one thousand dollars in hand paid, by the said Geo. C.
Spator, James M. Corbett and H. S. Dabham, trustees, the receipt thereof is
hereby acknowledged, do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Geo.
C. Spator, James M. Corbett and H. S. Dabham, trustees had their successors in
office a certain tract with one and a half acres of land, situate, attached
to the free white school heretofore, lying in Douglas District, County of
Southampton and State of Virginia, and joining the lands of Joseph N.
Dabham and the road leading to David Kitchin's at the bounds of S. C.
Dowell to them and their successors in office during the period, it is
used for and kept as a free white public school. That if at any time
cause or at any time the said District School Trustees should no longer
to use and shall no longer use the said land as a location for a public school
house, then and in that event the land shall revert and become the property
of the said Joseph N. Dabham or heirs, and in case of a removal of the
land to Joseph N. Dabham or heirs, by virtue of its being no longer used as a
site for a public school house, then all the buildings which the said School
Trustees or their successors in office shall have erected or bought on the said
land, and the same and appurtenances to remain on the said land shall continue
to be the absolute property of the public school in District No. 2 of South-
ampton County, and shall be at the disposal of the said District School
Trustees or their successors in office. And it is further agreed that Joseph
N. Dabham or his heirs may use the said school house for a private school
where not occupied by the public school.
