

The Court in and about 2nd of July 1777, James Hill and J. Scott of the County of
 Albemarle or Northampton, State of Virginia, granted of the first part, and that James of the same
 of H. Collins County and that James of the second part, witness that the said Hill and
 J. Scott doth and convey with the said James the following personal property,
 to wit: his the said Scott's entire crop of cotton, corn, fodder, black eyed peas, fruited
 wheat on his farm in Northampton, consisting of 35 acres in corn, 3 acres in cotton, 9
 acres in black eyed peas and 5 1/2 acres in fruited, said corn, fodder, peas, cotton and
 fruited, or a worth of them as may be necessary to be delivered at the store of J. H. Cuthbert
 in Smith River on or before the 1st day of September 1777, and in default of such delivery,
 the Smith River shall have the right to advertise said crops and sell them on the
 premises of said Scott and the said Scott bind himself to deliver said crops at the afore-
 said place of business of said Cuthbert as rapidly as they can be made ready for market
 at any time before the 1st day of September, and should the said Scott fail to make such
 delivery, then the said Cuthbert shall have the above mentioned right to sell on the premises.
 And the said Scott in addition to the above mentioned crops, grounds and conveyance with the
 said James the Smith River, the following personal property, to wit: two cows, all of
 which is conveyed, in Smith, to secure the following debt, to wit: one hundred dollars July 27th
 1777 and due by said Scott one day after date of fifty dollars and payable with said J.
 Cuthbert or order, also one hundred dollars May 1st 1777 and due by said Scott then 1st 1777 of
 seventy dollars and five (75⁰⁰) and payable with J. H. Cuthbert or order, and in de-
 fault of payment of either one of the said bonds, the Smith River shall sell any of said
 property conveyed in this instrument and pay the same from the proceeds of such sale.
 Witness the following signature and seal the 27th day of July 1777.

 This Deed of Debt made the 25th Oct. 1777, between J. H. Perkins of one part, and
 J. H. Perkins Justice of the second part, witness that in consideration of five
 dollars, the said Lewis doth hereby grant and convey with general warranty to the
 said Perkins the following real and personal property, to wit: a certain parcel of
 land in Northampton County containing 35 1/2 acres to be more or less bounded
 by the lands of Charles Harris, J. W. Drake, J. H. Perkins and others, also three cows
 with and its appurtenances and fixtures, four acres, Carry legs, chains and all the tools
