Council of the other part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, witnesses that for and full consideration of the sum of 2250^{rs} for that Seadshaw desired the said Peter Seadshaw of the first part, did grant unto the said George H. Council of the other part all his right, title and interest in a certain tract of land, known as the Henry Council's tract, containing 22 hundred five acres, to be more more or less, and bounded by the lands of George H. Council, John Council and others.

210 This Indenture made this 7th day of July, eight hundred and seventy six, between Robert Thomas Gillett Drury of the first part and Patrick A. Drury of the second part, each of the said County, witnesses that the said Gillett Drury, do hereby and lawfully himself and his heirs, to every and general advantage the right, title and interest in the Homestead upon which he now resides, containing 227¹/₂ acres, more or less, and bounded as herein described, on the north by Robert Hill's land, on the South by John H. Drury's land, on the West by John Chappell's land, and Patrick A. Drury, and his heirs forever. For the consideration of his heirs each for the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to be received at the death of the said Gillett Drury by said Patrick A. Drury, on to John H. Drury and the heirs to Gillett Augustus Drury or their heirs, the said being their respective portions of the said lands in money value. The said Patrick A. Drury to hold and keep the said Homestead subject only to duty of C^lgth Drury of the first part. The said lands to be paid in one year and three years respectively on the payment of the said lands the said Geo. H. Drury and Patrick A. Drury, signified having agreed to a justice, this agreement or else to justify all claims whatever to any part of my estate.
