consideration of five hundred and sixty two dollars and fifty cents to them in
hand paid by the said Mrs. Southard at and before the executing and delivery of this
present, the sum whereof is hereby acknowledged have languished and lie
and by these presents their language and will make the said Mrs. Southard his heirs
and assigns are forever freed or purged of land lying and being in Madison
County adjoining the lands of Lemire Smith on the west and Edward Longley
on the south, Elihu Darden on the east and Peter Smith on the north, con-
taining one hundred and fifty acres more or less, to have to hold the said two
or part of land with all its appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any
way appertaining unto the said Mrs. Southard his heirs and assigns forever to
the said G. D. Darden and Sarah S. his wife & by their presents freee from
debt the right and title of the said land to be good and valid henceforth the said
Mrs. Southard his heirs and assigns forever clear from and against the lawes
right or claims of themselves or any of their heirs, also clear from and against
the lawfull right or claims of all and every other person or persons whome
so much above the said G. D. Darden and Sarah S. his wife
have knowne set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year last
above written.
