Know all men by these presents, that I, Alton Edwards of the county of Smith and State of Virginia, being a husband and head of a family do hereby and to act of the General Assembly Inventing the manner in which a householder and head of a family may claim a homestead and personal property free and exempt from levy, sale or seizure declare and make known that to be my head of household in which I claim the following property to be held by me free and exempt from levy sale or seizure for the benefit of myself wife and children to wit, thirty five (35) barrels of corn valued at \$150, six hundred (600) lbs of fodder valued at \$30, three (3) cows valued at \$30, eighteen (18) pigs valued \$72, one (2) cart and wheel valued at \$30, forty (40) bushels of peas valued at \$30, one (1) horse valued at \$50, three (3) beds and furniture valued at \$30 and all other of my household and kitchen furniture not mentioned above valued at \$50. All of which do not exceed the value the sum of ten thousand dollars by value at the year of 1860. Witness my hand and seal this 26th day of November 1877.
