This Deed made this 17th day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy seven, between Richard A. Bellings, of the one part, and William D. Butler, of the other part, witnesses that the said Richard A. Bellings, of the one part, and the said W. D. Butler, of the other part, and certain tract or parcel of land containing three hundred and fifty five acres, more or less, situate in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, bounded as follows: on the south by the path running through what is called the Uppenberg field and the lands of the Harris Branch, and the land formerly belonging to Richard Williams dead, on the east by the land of A.
