Part to This Deed made this 18th day of January, in the year one thousand eight
hundred and seventy eight, between Richard Crawford Garrison and Henry Leslie Garrison
of the first part, Luther A. Edwards, Justice of the second part, and Joseph
Trotter, junior, of the third part, testimony: that the said parties of the first
part do hereby grant and convey, with general warranty, to the said party of the
second part, the following property, to wit: all of that lot or parcel of
land lying and situate in the town of Franklin, Southampton County, Virginia,
which was granted to the said Henry Leslie Garrison by Deed of Bargain and Sale
from Joseph A. Garrison dated September 16th 1877, reference to which latter Deed
is hereby made, in which said Deed of Bargain and Sale the said lot is de-
scribed as follows: beginning at a stone post located in the Centre of the County
Road of H. H. Hoffcock Corner; thence South along said Street 500 feet to
another stone post; a corner for this lot, thence South 56 Feet 20 Cents to a stone
post located at a corner for this lot, thence in a Southern direction, along a
line parallel with said Street to a point on the public Road leading from
Smith Spring to the town of Sandston 210 feet from said Street, thence off
the Centre of said Road to the stone post, nearly in front of the residence of H.
H. Hoffcock and a corner for him, the point of beginning, containing a little
more than one third of an acre of land more or less; which said lot of land
hereby intended to be conveyed is a part of the same lot of land which was
devised to the said Henry A. Garrison, by his father, the Rev. and Second Mrs. Garrison
in his last will and Testament, - the said parties of the first part grant the
said first described lot with all the buildings, privileges and appurtenances
thereto or thereto attached. And the said parties of the first part do hereby grant
and convey to the said Justice all of the right, title and interest of every kind whatever
in law or equity vested or contingent, which the said Richard Garrison may
have under the last will and Testament of his father, Richard Garrison deceased,
that is to say, in certain real estate lying in and near the said town of Sand-
ston, the truth to secure the payment of a certain debt due by him of some
date with this Deed, from the said H. A. Garrison to the said John Trotter junior
for the sum of eleven hundred dollars. And the said parties of the first
part hereby promise and agree to pay the interest on the said sum some one
month to the said Trotter, and furthermore to have and to continue to keep
the said parties of the first part to secure in some good, reliable fire Insurance
Company to be selected by the said John Trotter, in the sum of one thousand
dollars, and in the failure of the said parties of the first part to comply
with these two conditions or either of them on due time, it shall be discretionary
with the said John Trotter junior to enter the said Justice to make sale of the
said property herein conveyed, or to sue therefor, as may be necessary to pay
the said debt. And the said parties of the first part promise and agree to pay
