Deale and Little S. his wife of the County of Southampton State of Virginia, grantors of the first part and Spiller Smith of the County of St. Albans, State of Virginia, grantees of the second part, to wit: That and the contents of the sum of one thousand dollars to them and their heirs S. Deale and Little S. his wife have the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, they said James S.
