

Now Therefore This Deed made this 25th day of January 1828, between J. J. Butler, J. J. Butler, and J. A. Butler, heirs of N. Butler, of one part, and N. Butler of the second part, Witnesseth: That in consideration of the aforesaid premises and the sum of \$2000.00, the said parties of the first part do grant and convey, with special warranty, unto the said N. Butler this town square, situate north-east of lands, descent from the said N. Butler as aforesaid, free of and discharged from the lien of the aforesaid debt of said N. Butler the following description, to wit:

Southampton County, in the State of New York, January 26th 1828.

This Deed of Release from J. J. Butler, Justice, and J. A. Butler, heirs of N. Butler, doth, to N. Butler, and this day received and acknowledged by the said J. J. Butler as Justice, and J. A. Butler as heirs, to be their act and deed, and admitted to record.

This Deed of Release made this 25th day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy eight, between N. Butler, Justice of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, of the first part, and Tobias H. Whitlock, of the City of Richmond, State of Va. A Virginia Justice, wife of the said N. Butler, of the second part, Witnesseth as follows: Whereas, by a Marriage Agreement between the said N. Butler and Tobias H. Whitlock, upon their nuptials, made and entered into by the said N. Butler and N. Virginia Whitlock, upon their nuptials, in the office of the Court of Chancery for the said City of Richmond, State of Va. on the fourth day of January, A.D. 1826, the said N. Virginia Whitlock was appointed a Virginia Justice for the said N. Virginia Whitlock, now Justice wife of the said N. Butler, and whereas, the said N. Virginia Whitlock was, at that time, seized of certain of lands and personal estate which, by virtue of said marriage agreement, the said N. Butler, Justice as aforesaid, was authorized and directed, "to and for the use and separate use, advantage and discharge of the said N. Virginia Whitlock (now N. Virginia Butler) and to be managed, used and invested as he, the said Tobias H. Whitlock may deem best, with the advice and assent of the said N. Virginia Whitlock, from time to time, her said marriage notwithstanding: And whereas, the said Tobias H. Whitlock, Justice as aforesaid, by and with the advice, consent, direction and assent of the said N. Virginia Butler, has this day invested the following sum, to wit: the sum of Seven thousand dollars (\$7000.00) for the benefit of the said N. Virginia Butler, in the following real and personal estate this day purchased by the said Justice from the said N. Butler: To wit: That Tobias Whitlock, that the said Justice from the said N. Butler Justice: Now This Deed Witnesseth, that the said Justice for and on behalf of the said N. Virginia Butler, has this day paid to him by the said N. Butler, Justice as aforesaid, the receipt of which said sum is hereby acknowledged, with hearty grant and conveyance with general warranty, the following real and personal property, to the said Justice: all that tract or parcel of land on which the said N. Butler Justice now stands, being the same on which his Justice formerly resided, supposed to contain twelve hundred and more or less, lying and said County of Southampton and bounded as follows: Commencing in the center of the public road leading from Southampton to Smithfield, thence along the line of land N. Williams John Williams, Oliver A. Williams, J. Butler Justice, John A. Hay, W. H. Buggs, the tract being granted by Deed of Gift from N. Thomas J. Butler doth to be and the said Justice, Community, in the County of Southampton, the lands of Joseph A.
