Articles of Agreement made and entered into this 4th day of March 1878, between Joshua K.eland of the first part and J. K. and J. C. Plaine partners in and under the style of J. K. and J. C. Plaine of the second part, whereby: that the said J. K. and J. C. Plaine have agreed to make a conveyance to the said J. K. eland during the year 1878, in money and supplies to an amount not to exceed two hundred and twenty five dollars exclusive of two hundred and thirty five dollars for which he is to deliver up to the said J. K. eland a certain quantity of his soil upon his tract of land in Southampton Co. containing 1500 to 2000 square feet, weighing and grading to be made in return for the said tract, the said amount and supplies to be used by said J. K. eland in the cultivation of his soil upon his tract of land in Southampton Co. containing the said lot and one eighth, the consideration of said conveyance the said J. K. eland hereby gives and grants a land upon all his crops cotton and corn to give with the soil due him from said tract to wit: One 1/2 bush cotton and 1/2 bush corn and to be made during the year 1878, and the said J. K. eland further agrees to deliver the said crops to J. K. and J. C. Plaine and to be used by them
