Now the said Adolphus Good on his part and in consideration of the above premises hath hereby granted a lien to the said Jas. J. Rendon out and late of cotton to weigh not less than five hundred pounds of raw said lint or enough to pay out and to be made on the said Rendon's lands. For the amount advanced to him this year which has been and was intended to have been repaid, and the said Good binds himself agreeable to law to ^{the} said cotton above mentioned to Jas. J. Rendon at Newbern, North Carolina, by or before the 1st day of Nov. 1878. This Lien is granted under an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 27, 1878, entitled an Act to amend an Act for a general land purpose. Witness the following signature and seals:

Articles of Agreement made and entered into this 19th day March 1878 between J. A. and J. S. Prince, partners in trade under the style of J. A. & J. S. Prince of the first part and Alvin Rice of the second, witnesses that the said J. A. & J. S. Prince have agreed to make advances to the said Alvin Rice during the year 1878 in scribbles and merchandise to an amount not to exceed one hundred and seventy five dollars exclusive of one hundred and additional Star Brand fertilizer which is to be delivered in full and for which the said Rice gives and grants a lien above and late due scribbles. Cotton to weigh 500 lbs to be delivered and fulfilled by Nov. 1, 1878, the freight and grade to be made in return by Alvin and his heirs. All the supplies to be used by him the said Rice in the cultivation of the soil upon the tract of land in the County of Southampton aforesaid to use seeds. In consideration of such supplies the said Alvin Rice gives and grants a lien to said J. A. & J. S. Prince upon all his crops cotton, corn and fodder made during the year 1878, and the said Rice agrees to deliver to said J. A. & J. S. Prince the crop cotton by Nov. 1, and corn and fodder by July 1, 1879. Witness the following signatures.
