This Agreement made and entered into this 33rd day of March 1878, between J. C. Bailey of the first part and Geo. George of the second part, witnesses as follows: that whereas, the said Geo. George is engaged in the cultivation of the said and adjacent to obtain supplies during the year 1878, from the said J. C. Bailey for the amount of one hundred dollars and the said J. C. Bailey having agreed to furnish the said supplies, the said George on his part and in consideration of the above advanced and promised, did hereby grant a lien to the said J. C. Bailey on all the crops that may be made during the year 1878 upon the lands that the said George cultivate for the amount of the above advanced and the cost of this agreement. It is furthermore agreed by the parties to this agreement that the said crops shall be delivered to the said J. C. Bailey on or before the first day of Dec. 1878, and that one fourth of the said crops is to be sold within it at 10¢ or through the said J. C. Bailey until this agreement is satisfied. This law is quoted under an act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 3rd 1878, entitled an act to secure advances for agriculture in poor years.
