This Agreement made and entered into this 30th day of March 1875 between J. C. Bailey of the first part and William Sykes of the second part, witnesses as follows: that whereas the said William Sykes is engaged in the cultivation of the soil and is desirous to obtain supplies during the year 1875, from the said J. C. Bailey for the amount of \$100. Sixty dollars, signed that and to be paid not go and the said J. C. Bailey having agreed to furnish the said supplies, And the said Sykes on his part and as consideration of the above advance and promise does hereby grant a lien to the said J. C. Bailey on all the crops that may be made during the year 1875 upon the lands that the said Sykes cultivate for the amt. of the above advance and the cost of this agreement. It is furthermore agreed by the parties to this Agreement that the said crops shall be delivered to the said J. C. Bailey on or before the first day of Nov. 1875, and that no part of said crops is to be sold, except it is by and through the said J. C. Bailey until this agreement is satisfied. This Lien is granted under and act of the General Assembly of Va. approved April 3rd 1875, entitled and act to secure advances for agricultural purposes.
