first part, and Wm. H. Coll of the second part, both of the County of South-
ampton in the State of Virginia, testimony: that the said Margaret Anna
Coll administratrix with the will annexed of John Coll, decd., by virtue and
authority of the will of the said John Coll, decd. and in consideration of the
sum of five hundred dollars which has been paid, did grant, bargain and
sell unto the said Wm. H. Coll the following tract or parcel of land, con-
taining by estimation seventy four acres, and bounded as follows, commencing
at White Oak Branch where the Potomack empties into the Indian Branch, then
running up the Potomack to its head, then a straight line in an easterly
direction to a mark but a new made corner, thence a line of nearly seventy
acres in a westerly direction to the corner of the said Wm. H. Coll and the late
