This Writing or Agreement between J. A. Kramlin and Benjamin Gooding and P. S. Shuman, creating a lien on the crops of said Kramlin and Gooding for money or advanced, was this day reviewed and together with the certificate thereto annexed, admitted to record.

This Agreement made this 15th day of April in the year 1878, between C. C. Williams of the first part, and James A. Kramlin of the other part, both of the County of Southampton State of Virginia, witnesseth as follows. Whereas the said James A. Kramlin is engaged in, or is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and it appears that the said C. C. Williams shall, during the present year, make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which the said C. C. Williams has agreed to do. Now this Agreement witnesseth that the said C. C. Williams do hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said James A. Kramlin during the present year, such manure, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies, (not exceeding the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty dollars in currency) as may be required by the said James A. Kramlin to cultivate and gather his crops, provided he be made the present year. And the said James A. Kramlin hereby gives and grants to the said C. C. Williams a lien upon all such crops as he may gather the present year, to wit: Corn, fodder, peas, pimientos, Cotton and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated. This Agreement is made in pursuance of and Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 2^d 1875.

Pinner are willing and have agreed to furnish said Harding to an amount not exceeding Forty dollars. Now therefore the said Harding hereby gives and grants to the said J. A. and J. B. Pinner an and lien of Cotton and of fresh picking, said Cotton to be delivered by 15th Nov. 1878, and the said to except it 15th do.
