That petitioning from Suther & Edwards to Kerminger, Lebridge and Coyle, asking a lien on the crops of the said Edwards for moneys or advances, on the day aforesaid and together with the certificate thereunto, admitted to record.

Case

That Agreement entered into the 6<sup>th</sup> day of May 1798, between Barlow and Kyrick of the first part, and Austin Seigh of the other part, notwithstanding in former that certain the said Austin Seigh is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil and is desirous to obtain supplies during the year 1798 from the said Barlow and Kyrick for the amount of forty five dollars beyond which amount the said Austin Seigh shall not go and the said Barlow and Kyrick having agreed on their part to furnish said supplies, now the said Austin Seigh on his part, and on consideration of the above provisions, does hereby grant a lien to the said Barlow and Kyrick on all the crops which may be made during the year 1798, upon the lands of which the said Austin Seigh cultivates for the above amount of advances which has been or was intended to have been expended. Now it is further more agreed by the parties to this agreement, that the said Barlow and Kyrick shall be first paid and satisfied after which the balance, if any, shall be paid over to the said Austin Seigh. This lien is granted under an act of the General Assembly of Virginia, passed April 27<sup>th</sup> 1798, entitled an act to secure the advances for agricultural purposes.

That petitioning from Austin Seigh to Kinkaid & Harris, asking a lien on the crops of the said Seigh for moneys or advances, on the day aforesaid and moved by the acts of R. R. Kinkaid and A. Harris, the two undersigned citizens do think, and admitted to record.

Case

J. Jack's Heiry Whitehead of the county of Southampton, State of Virginia do demand a satisfaction of an agreement by him and Robert of the City of Norfolk, to the said State of Virginia, to make advances of provisions to me during the present year for about 1798, on all the cultivation of the crops hereinafter named (said advances not to exceed the sum of thirty one dollars and sixty cents) and to secure the payment of the said advances I do hereby assign to said Row and Robert above certain of personal property, to wit: all my acres of cotton and corn, to be raised by me on the following described lands, shown & now under belonging to the City of Norfolk, State during the year 1798, and also to the moneys and other clear moneys, but in this special trust, that if I fail to pay said indebtedness on or before the first day of November 1798, then the said Row and Robert may take possession of said property, and sell same, or so much thereof as may be necessary, by and by auction for each first giving two days notice at three public places, and applying the proceeds of such sale to the payment of said indebtedness and interest on same, after paying my expenses to me.
