Briggs on one half acre of land of first picking up to be made during the year 1878, amounting not less than \$50.00, for the amount advanced to him, and which has been or will be advanced to him, and the said Edwards has bound himself to have the same repaid, and the said Edwards has bound himself to have to deliver said crop or crops to the said B. F. Briggs at Portsmouth N.H. by or before the first day of November 1878.
