

Land & slaves worth Joseph A. Whithead Thirty dollars to enable the said Joseph A. Whithead
to practice Law & carry on his farming operations on the land owned by John H. Clark for the
year 1878. And I do so in consideration of the sum advanced and further ad-
vance agreed to be made and the further consideration of one dollar to the said
Joseph A. Whithead paid by the said Littleton S. Pepe to myself of which a bill
acknowledged the said Joseph A. Whithead being conscious and agreed that the
said advance shall constitute a fine bill all the costs of every described grain-
ing and to be planted and grown by the said Joseph A. Whithead upon said land
during the year 1878. The said Joseph A. Whithead further agreed to deliver to
the said Littleton S. Pepe all cattle grain or stock kept during the year 1878, to
have and to hold for the following purpose, to wit: If the said Joseph A. Whit-
head shall fail or die before the 1st day of December 1878 to pay the said debt then
the said Littleton S. Pepe shall after ten days notice at three public places in said
county sell all the property herein mentioned for cattle and cost of purchase pay
said debt, interest until paid, and balance of such property pay over to the said
Joseph A. Whithead or his assigns.

of his farm and together with the anticipate rents aforesaid, arrived to make
Suffolk, Va. March 11th 1878.

Amount and Expenses all used by them hereinabove, about \$1000.00 of the County of Southampton
paid to them and to themselves in consideration of the sum of one hundred and twenty dol-
lars advanced me by Dr. C. H. Kinsland in supplies, merchandise &
accrued by due bills and notes for the same, do all and convey unto him the
foregoing property to wit: One mule now in my possession and all my crop
of cotton, peanuts, corn and fodder saved and raised in the year 1878, to
have and to hold to him, the grantor, and his heirs or assigns forever. Do
and they property, free of all incumbrances, and fully cleared the right. It is
agreed, however, that if the grantor, or any assignee thereof, pay unto Dr. C. H.
Kinsland or his assignee, the sum above named, or before the 1st day of
December 1878, in payment for the property, land, cattle and payment, shall
not waste, damage, injure, sell or remove the same and in case of injury or death
from any cause, of any cattle, horse or hogs, thus damaged and injured, shall
and agree to pay for the full value thereof, animal or otherwise, except
that, those three persons, and everything belonging thereto, shall now and here-
after remain in force and effect, to default in giving certificate to
