Whereas, in order to enable W. C. Pease to carry out his farming operations during the year 1878, it is necessary for him to borrow a certain sum of money; and whereas W. C. Pease has agreed to lend Pease for that purpose the sum of six hundred dollars, as is evidenced by his bond of trust dated this 11th day of May 1878, and whereas W. H. Daigle, Jno. K. Pease, Luther Edwards and A. J. Davis are Sureties for said Bond on five different bonds above by said Pease to W. C. Pease given for payment of said Pease, and whereas the said Pease is in a certain debt of trust incurred by him to Jno. C. Pease, trustee, to secure and save him fully the said Sureties from any loss by virtue of said Suretyship, did agree to execute a trust deed to said Jno. C. Pease upon all the crops he might make in any one year for the benefit of sureties, which said debt is of record in the Clerk's Office of Southampton and is hereby referred to. Now therefore this deed made this 11th day of May 1878, between the said W. C. Pease of one part and Jno. C. Pease of the second part, witnesseth that no consideration of but dollars in hand paid - the said Pease bonds grants and conveys unto the said Jno. C. Pease, trustee, all his entire crops of every kind, that he may make during the year 1878, and his debts and the crops of all his tenants so far as to secure first, bond due J. D. Lewis for six hundred dollars, due and dated May 11, 1878, and secondly, to seven and three quarters the amount due and from any and all other crops of the said Pease, and that the said Pease and that the said Pease may discharge of the said debts at his discretion provided the present debts are regularly appropriated to the liquidation of the debts as classified in this deed.
