This Agreement made this 31st day of May in the year 1878, between J. Z. Hales of the first part, and Jacob Cornwell of the other part, both of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, witnesseth as follows, wherein the said Jacob Cornwell is engaged, not to be absent to engage the remainder of the said, and a district that the said J. Z. Hales shall during the present year make certain advances to the said contractor of the said part, the said J. Z. Hales has agreed to do. Now this agreement witnesseth that the said J. Z. Hales has hereby promised and agreed to advance and forward to the said Jacob Cornwell, during the present year, such amount for his fortifiers and their supplies, not exceeding the sum of one hundred dollars (one hundred) as may be needed to enable the said Jacob Cornwell to collect and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year. And the said Jacob Cornwell hereby gives and grants to the said J. Z. Hales a lien upon such crops as he may make the present year, to wit: Corn, tobacco, peas, potatoes, etc., and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding for the above date. This agreement is made in pursuance of an act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 2nd 1878.
