Thomas of County of Canning and has agreed to furnish to said Kullback to an amount not exceeding said sum of one hundred dollars, Now this agreement made and entered into this 16<sup>th</sup> day of April 1875, between the said Kullback and the said Thomas, witnesses that in consideration of the undertaking agreed on the part of the said Thomas, that the said Kullback does hereby give and grant unto the said Thomas a lien on all the crops grown by said Kullback during the year 1875 to secure the above said advancement of one hundred dollars from the said Thomas to said Kullback. And said Kullback does hereby further agree that he, the said Kullback, will deliver to said Thomas, at his own house at Saco, upriver Va. on or before the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November 1875, so much of said crops as may be sufficient to pay for said advancement of one hundred dollars.

This Agreement made and entered into this 16<sup>th</sup> day of April 1875, between Joseph A. Dorcham of the first part and John S. Kullback of the second part, witnesses that whereas, the said John S. Kullback is engaged in the cultivation of the soil and desires to obtain supplies during the year 1875, from the said Joseph A. Dorcham for the amount of three hundred (\$300) dollars and the said Joseph A. Dorcham having agreed to furnish said supplies and in consideration of the above advancement said parties, the said John S. Kullback do hereby grant a lien to the said Joseph A. Dorcham on his half of all the crops which may be made and grown during the year 1875, upon the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November of above advance. And the said John S. Kullback does hereby certify that he has cultivated or has cultivated by tenant of the said Joseph A. Dorcham on his own land, grounds of four or five acres, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and it is further agreed by the said parties to this agreement that the crop and property above referred to is to be delivered to Joseph A. Dorcham on or before the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November 1875. Witness the following signatures.
