Whereas, the late Dr. W. Garrison, in his life time, he sold, on the year eighteenth, contracted with the Trustees of the History House, African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church, for the sale of a certain first or parcel of land, containing a house of worship, lying in the County of Saugun, containing one acre more or less, and bounded on the South by lands of Dr. W. Garrison, on the North and East by the lands of Capt. J. C. Smith, and on the West by the lands of Dr. W. Garrison, and whereas, the said Dr. W. Garrison, died before recording, is dead for said land: and whereas, in a certain deed on January, against the said Dr. W. Garrison, brought by the Trustees of said Church, in the Circuit Court of Saugun County, at the November Term 1793, of said Court, the undersigned are appointed as Special Commissioners, to receive and collect the remainder of the purchase money due on said land, and of making a deed with Special authority conveying the same to parties bound, hereafter named, and their successors in Office, for the redemption and benefit of the congregation of said church: and whereas, the Trustees of said Church have agreed to the undersigned in accordance with the terms of the aforesaid Court, the remainder of the purchase money on said land. Therefore, We do authorize the said for and in consideration of the premises, the undersigned, Special Commissioners, do hereby with Special authority, unto Joseph Smith, James Bennett, Anthony Smith, Thomas and William Hunt, Trustees of the History House, African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church, and their successors in Office, do hereby, from a parcel of land above described, containing one acre more or less to be sold by them, in full, to and to the use, satisfaction and benefit of the congregation of the aforesaid History House Church.
