Deed purmised of and order of the County Court of Southampton issued at its January Term 1873, as the undersigned Commissioner appointed by said Court to attest to the wife of John Jameson, Esq., holder of Carr Hallbank deit and land of the said estate of which in Holton did surge or make the following sheet, viz.
