 April 2nd 1878 B. Hennin do hereby acknowledge, have granted, bargained and
 sold and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said C. Brumpler
 and Richard A. Blayton all my crops of corn, forage, Peas, Beans and
 Potatoes. I have and take the said granted and bargained crops up
 to the said C. Brumpler and R. Blayton their heirs executors, administrators
 and assigns to their own proper use benefit and behoef for
 ever and the said B. Hennin does warrant himself to be the true and
 lawful owner of the goods (said crops) and effects hereby sold and to
 have in himself full power, goodright and lawful authority to dispose
 of the said Crops in manner as aforesaid and I do forswear by my
 heirs executors and administrators lawfully convened and agreed to waiv-
 e and defend the said crops unto the said C. Brumpler and R.
 Blayton their heirs executors administrators and assigns against
 the lawful claims and demands of all persons whom so ever.

 one part and Robert N. Bain (Trustee) of the other part both of the
 County of Southampton and State of Virginia witnesseth that the
 said Mallory Marquard (Trustee) doth grant and convey unto the
 said Robert N. Bain (Trustee) the following property to wit: One
 Horse and two hells and all of his growing crop of any description
 consisting of crops of corn, Peas, Beans, &c. In trust to secure a
 sum of Fifty Dollars of even date with this deed due 10% interest
 and it is agreed that the Trustee shall have five percent commis-
 sion allowed him to see the foregoing property. Witness the following
